HISTORY OF THE NAVAL & MARITIME ACADEMY

The Naval and Maritime Academy (NMA) plays the most prominent role by imparting professional training for Officers and Senior / Junior ratings in the Sri Lanka Navy. The Academy is situated within the picturesque Naval Dockyard, Trincomalee. Trincomalee is considered as one of the best natural harbours in the world with rich history of maritime affiliation.

The origin of training in the Sri Lanka Navy dates back to 1951 when a humble beginning was made by then Royal Ceylon Navy by the establishment of a Recruit Training Centre at HMCyS Rangalla (named after Rahangala Hill) Diyatalawa. In 1965, a seaman training establishment was set up at HMCyS Parakrama, at that time in HMCyS Tissa, Trincomalee was providing the administrative support. Since then necessity of establishing a separate Training establishment for Navy was felt.



Commander MGS Perera The Founding Father of NMA

The NMA was established at present location on 15th January 1967 and was subsequently commissioned on 15th July 1967 with Instructor Commander MGS Perera as the first Commandant who was also the main pillar behind establishment of the NMA as its proud founder father. With the establishment of NMA, Officer training which were then undertaken by the Britannia Royal Naval College Dartmouth, came within the ambit of the NMA.

The NMA has proved its mettle by training an umpteen number of Officers and Sailors to cater the needs of the Sri Lanka Navy and still it shoulders that endeavour, being unparalleled to any other training institutions. Apart from initial officer training for various entrants, the NMA today conducts Sub Lieutenant Technical Courses for Executive, Logistics, NPM, SBS, Provost and Marine branch officers. In addition to that NMA conducts training for other officer grades such as Direct Entry (Degree holders), Service Entry and Short Service commissioned schemes.

The Officer Cadet Entry scheme was accredited to the esteemed University of Kelaniya in the 2001 and in year 2011 onward NMA got accredited to Kotelawala Defence University while upgrading its training contents to meet the Naval & National demands. All Officer Under Trainees who undergo the stipulated programmes at present are conferred with a Bachelor of Science Degree in Naval and Maritime Studies, Naval Studies and Naval Logistics Management.

In the sense of preparing officers with required professionalism, The NMA has recently stepped into a new milestone by commencing four Executive Branch Long specialization courses. Prior to that Long Logistics Management Course was the first ever in house specialization course led to a MBA degree. To maintaining high standards in staff duties, the NMA conducts Junior Naval Staff Course regularly for junior officers. The training for naval ratings encompasses Phase III and advanced training courses comprised of branch training, specialization training, mechanical and technical training.

The NMA continues to strive and achieve international standards whilst holding the ISO 9001:2015 Quality Management System Certification awarded by the Sri Lanka Standards Institution in the year 2016. In recognition of the yeoman service rendered over the years, The NMA was awarded with the prestigious President Colours in 2003.

Therefore, the exact professional excellence of Naval and Maritime Academy is epitomized without a shadow of a doubt today. The motto, 'The disciplined are the noblest of men' is conceptually leading the institution to exact objectives. Accomplishments of Sri Lanka Navy over the past decades bear the testimony to the effective quality of training imparted by the Naval and Maritime Academy.






